1 Important

- Where the plug of the Direct Plug-in Adapter is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

Warning

- Make sure that you always have easy access to the power cord, plug or adaptor to disconnect the device from the power.

Risk of swallowing coin battery





Overview of the main unit



- ① **Dock for the iPod/iPhone**
- ② **+ / -**
 - Adjust volume.
 - As LED indicators, show system status.
- ③ **⏻**
 - Turn the docking speaker on or off.
 - Switch the docking speaker to standby mode.
- ④ **Power supply socket**
 - Connect AC power.
- ⑤ **USB**
 - Sync with PC through a USB cable.
- ⑥ **MP3-LINK**
 - Connect an external audio device.

Overview of the remote control



- ① 
 - Select iPod/iPhone dock mode.
- ② 
 - Skip to a track.
 - Search within play.
- ③ 
 - Adjust volume.
- ④ 
 - Mute or restore volume.
- ⑤ 
 - Start or pause play.
- ⑥ 
 - Select MP3 link mode.

3 Get started

Always follow the instructions in this chapter in sequence.


Prepare the remote control

For first-time use:

Remove the protective tab to activate the remote control battery.

To replace the remote control battery:

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert one CR2025 battery with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.



Connect power

This docking speaker can be powered on by either AC power or batteries.


Option 1: AC power

! Caution

- Risk of product damage! Make sure that the power supply voltage matches the voltage printed on the bottom of the unit.
- Risk of electric shock! When you unplug the AC adaptor, always pull the plug from the socket. Never pull the cord.

Connect the AC power adaptor to:

- the power socket at the back of the docking speaker;
- the wall socket.




Option 2: Battery power

! Caution

- Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.
- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.


- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert 4 x 1.5V AA batteries (not supplied) with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.



Turn on

Press \odot to turn the docking speaker on.

↳ The + / - LED indicators light up.



Switch to standby mode

The docking speaker switches to standby mode in following situations:

- Press \odot again;
- The speaker is idle for 15 minutes when powered by AC supply.
- The iPod/iPhone or external audio device is disconnected when the speaker is operated on batteries.

↳ The + / - LED indicators light off.



Note

- In standby mode, if you press \square or \blacksquare on the remote control, the docking speaker switches to the corresponding selected source.

4 Play

Play from iPod/iPhone

You can enjoy audio from your iPod/iPhone through this docking speaker.



Listen to the iPod/iPhone

Philips **DockStudio** app brings a suite of new features to your docking speaker, including Internet radio and a multi-function alarm clock. To enjoy more features, you are recommended to install this free application.

- 1 Insert the iPod/iPhone into the dock.
 - ↳ The docking system switches to Dock source automatically.
 - ↳ The LED indicators light up.



- 2 For first-time use, you will be asked to install **DockStudio** app on your iPod/iPhone.
- 3 Tap **[Yes]** (yes) to accept the installation request.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.



- 5 Launch the app after the installation.
- 6 Play audio on your iPod/iPhone.
 - ↳ Audio comes out through this docking speaker.

Tip

- You can press  on the remote control to select Dock source.

Note

- With the **DockStudio** app, you can enjoy music, set clock and alarm, adjust sound settings, and update firmware if necessary.

- To pause or resume play, press **▶||**.
- To skip to a track, press **◀/▶**.
- To search during play, press and hold **◀/▶**, and then release to resume normal play.

Update firmware

If firmware update is available, the **DockStudio** app will search for it automatically and ask you to download it.

Note

- Make sure that your iPod/iPhone is inserted in the docking speaker and connected to the Internet.

1 If a new firmware update is found, tap **OK**.



2 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the firmware update.



Note

- Do not disconnect power or undock the iPod/iPhone during the updating process.

Charge the iPod/iPhone

Note

- If the docking speaker is operated on the batteries, you cannot charge your iPod/iPhone.

When the docking speaker is connected to AC power, the docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge.

Tip

- For certain iPod models, it may take up to a minute before the charging indication appears.

Sync iPod/iPhone with PC

Note

- Make sure that iTunes has been configured properly in your PC.

- 1 Insert the iPod/iPhone in the dock.
- 2 Press ϕ to switch the docking speaker to standby mode.
↳ The LED indicators light off.
- 3 Connect your docking speaker and PC with a USB cable.
- 4 Launch iTunes to synchronize your docking speaker with PC.
↳ The docked iPod/iPhone is synchronized with PC successfully through the iTunes.

Note

- Due to different materials and product techniques, some USB cables may not work with this device.

Play from an external device

With this docking speaker, you can also enjoy audio from an external device such as an MP3 player.

Note

- Make sure that no iPod/iPhone is docked in the speaker.

- 1 If no iPod/iPhone is docked, connect an MP3 link cable (3.5mm, not supplied) to:
 - the **MP3-LINK** socket at the back of the docking speaker.
 - the headphone socket on an external device.↳ The docking speaker switches to MP3 link mode automatically.
- 2 Play music on the device (see the device's user manual).


Tip

- You can select MP3 link source by pressing  on the remote control.

Adjust volume

To adjust volume:

- Press +/- on the remote control;
- Press +/- on your docking speaker; or
- Adjust the volume control of your iPod/iPhone or external device.



Tip

- If the docking speaker is powered by batteries, the volume is lower than that by AC supply.

Mute sound

During play, press  to mute or restore sound.

6 Troubleshooting



Warning

- Never remove the casing of this device.

No power

- Make sure that the AC power adaptor of the device is connected properly.

No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume of your docking speaker.
- Adjust the volume of your iPod/iPhone or external audio device.

No response from the unit

- Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, and then switch on the device again.

Cannot sync with PC

- Switch the docking speaker to standby mode.
- Try another USB cable.
- Install iTunes in PC properly.
